TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1997 TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT) (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2017

Strathroy Wind Farm Re-Design - Erection and Operation of a Wind Farm for a period of 35 years, comprising a total of 7 wind turbines with Turbines 1,2,3 and 5 having a maximum blade tip height of 180m, Turbine 4 having a maximum blade tip height of 160m, and Turbines 6 and 7 having a maximum blade tip height of 149.9m, battery energy storage system, access tracks, borrow pit, substation, control building, and ancillary infrastructure.

In accordance with the provisions of Regulation 31 of the above Regulations, The Highland Council hereby gives notice that planning permission has been **refused** by the Council for Strathroy Wind Farm Re-Design - Erection and Operation of a Wind Farm for a period of 35 years, comprising a total of 7 wind turbines with Turbines 1, 2, 3 and 5 having a maximum blade tip height of 180m, Turbine 4 having a maximum blade tip height of 160m, and Turbines 6 and 7 having a maximum blade tip height of 149.9m, battery energy storage system, access tracks, borrow pit, substation, control building, and ancillary infrastructure, proposed by Energiekontor at Land At Torr Leathann Strathroy, Ardross Alness.
